The *Small English Atlas* was first published in weekly parts beginning in November 1748. According to an advertisement Surrey appeared in part II on 26 November 1748 together with Cornwall, Berkshire and Suffolk. The part-work was advertised by a group of nine London publishers, but before publication was complete the atlas was taken over by Thomas Kitchin and Thomas Jefferys. The only member of the group of nine original publishers to appear on the title-page of the first bound edition of the atlas in 1749 was M. Payne, who is named as a distributor of the book.

Below the map is a list in three columns of towns with their parliamentary representation and the dates of their markets and fairs. The list is headed *Surrey is bounded on the West by Berkshire and Hampshire, on the South by Sussex, on the East by Kent, and is parted from Middlesex on the North by the River Thames.*

This map closely resembles Thomas Kitchin's map (43) in *England Illustrated* and Joseph Ellis's *English Atlas* map (44), although it is larger and lacks their attractive cartouches. It seems probable that Lodge copied his map from Ellis. The *Remarks* are identical to those on Ellis's map, which differed slightly from Kitchin's and the place name changes which appeared on the Ellis map are also present on Lodge's. The fact that the Ellis map was still available in 1790 when the Lodge map was engraved although Kitchin's map had not been re-published since it last appeared twenty-five years earlier in 1765 in *Kitchin's English Atlas* also makes Ellis appear a more likely source. When he engraved his map Lodge introduced a few more differences in place names: *Purbright Manor* (*Purbright Mannor* in Kitchin and Ellis), *Bannar* (*Banmer*), *Gutton* (*Gatton*), *Coldon* (*Colsdon*), *Conyhurst* (*Connyhust*), *Rubbing House* (*Rubing House*).

The London Magazine published county maps of England and Wales by Thomas Kitchin at irregular intervals between November 1747 and September 1763. The Surrey map appeared in March 1750 and a similar map (36) was published by Sarah and John Exshaw in the Dublin edition of the magazine in the same month. A map by John Gibson (48), which was a close copy of this one, was published in *The Universal Museum and Complete Magazine of Knowledge and Pleasure* in 1769.

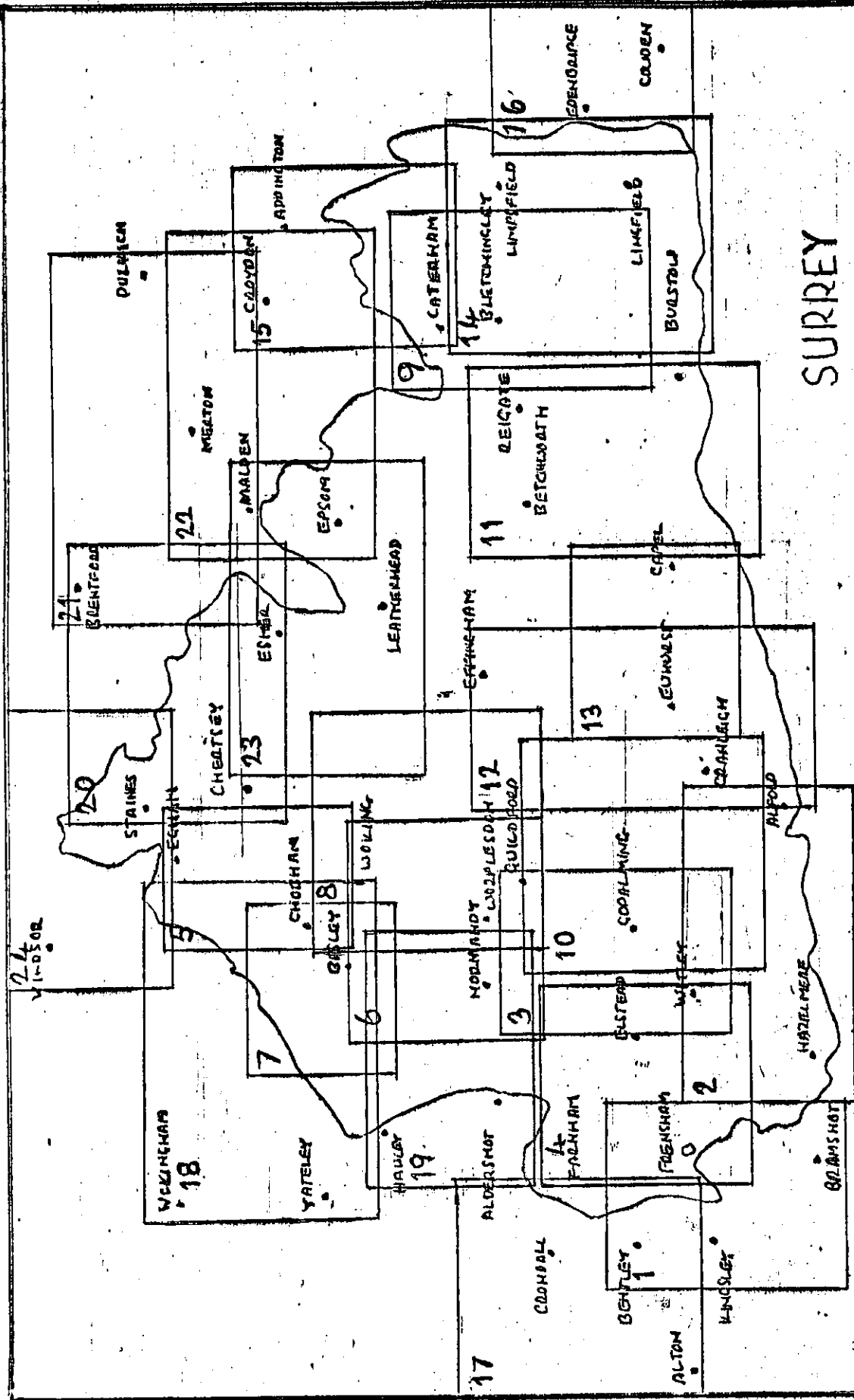

Sheet VIII - Dorking - covers most of Surrey but omits the area north of Wimbledon and a strip about 3½ miles wide on the Kent border. These areas are to be found on sheets VII.I and VI.

On completion of the engraving in 1816 the copper plate was used to print all copies of the sheet issued until about 1852. After this date the copper plate was used as a master plate for electrotype plates and these were used for the actual printing until about 1880.

During this period of more than sixty years many alterations and additions were made, worn parts of the plate were recut and this has resulted in many state of this map. All are dated 1816 though later issues also state the electrotype date.

The Society owns a complete set of the original ninety sheets under M15 and a further seven copies of sheet VIII. A provisional date list of impressions has been made and the map catalogue has been annotated.

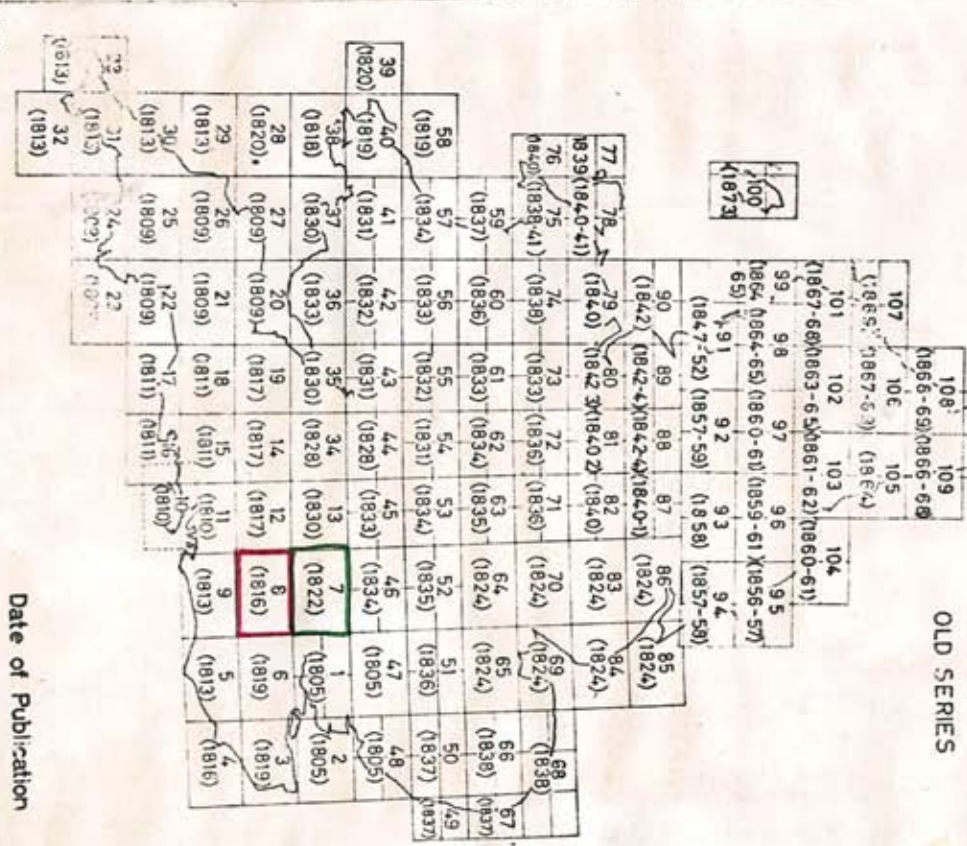

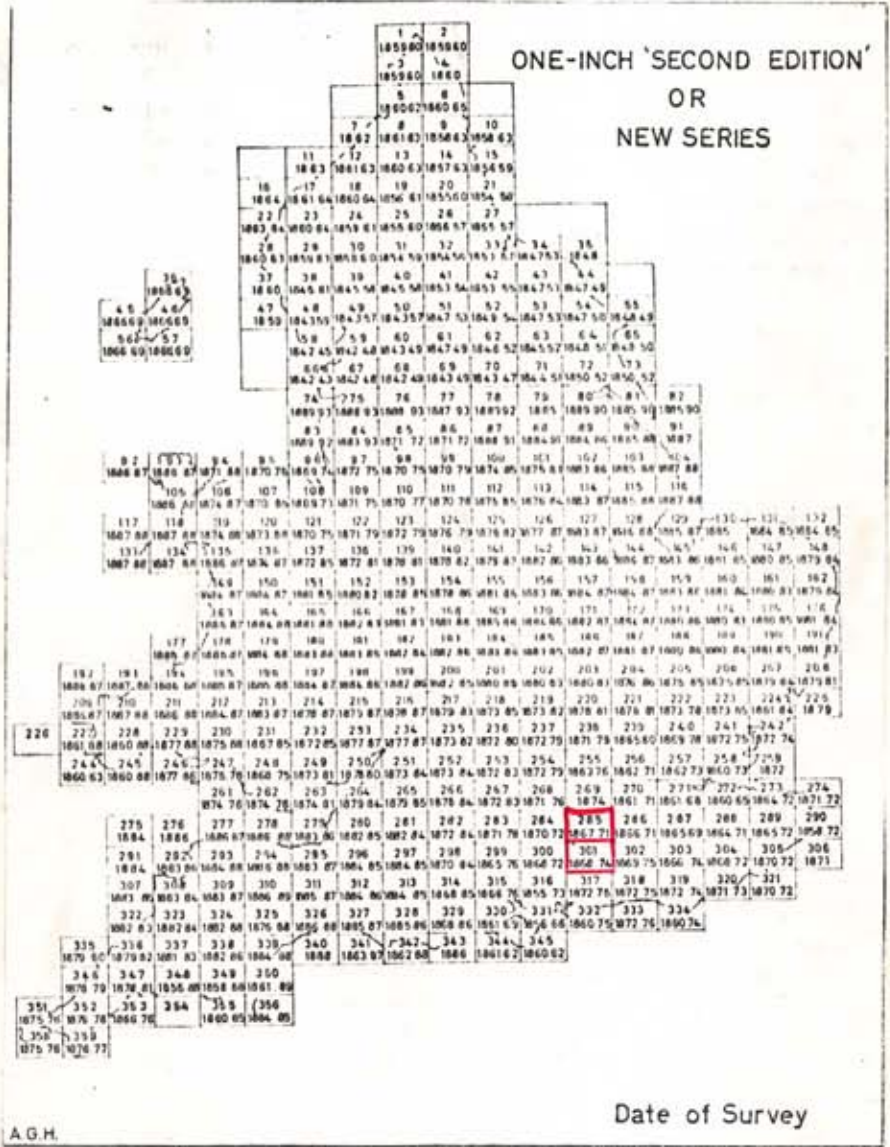

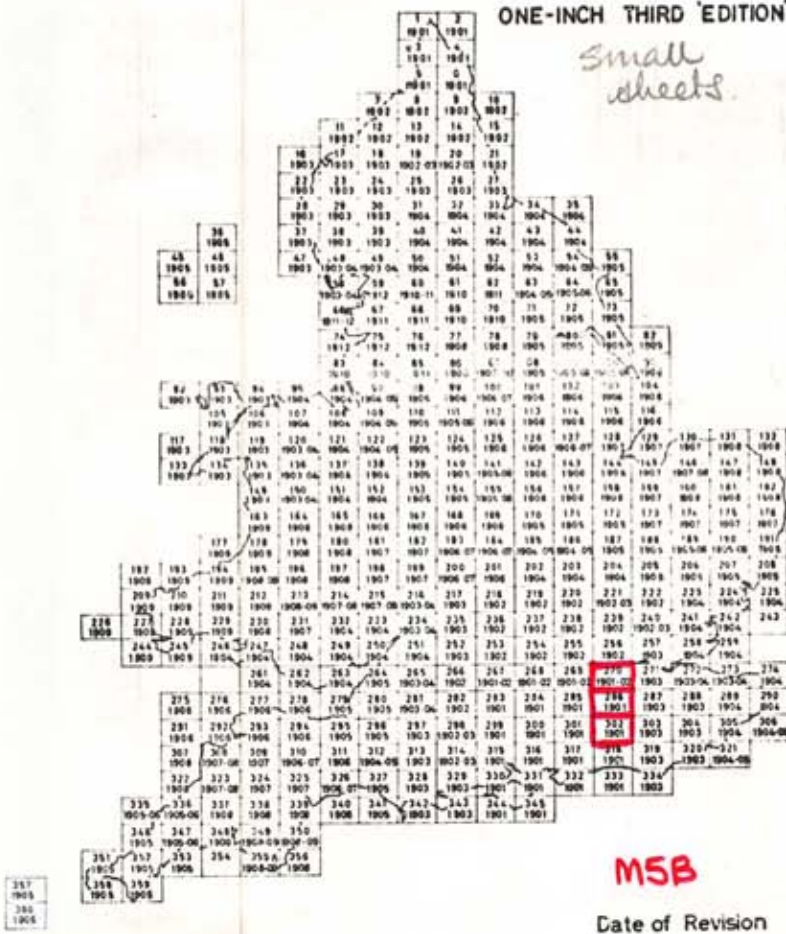
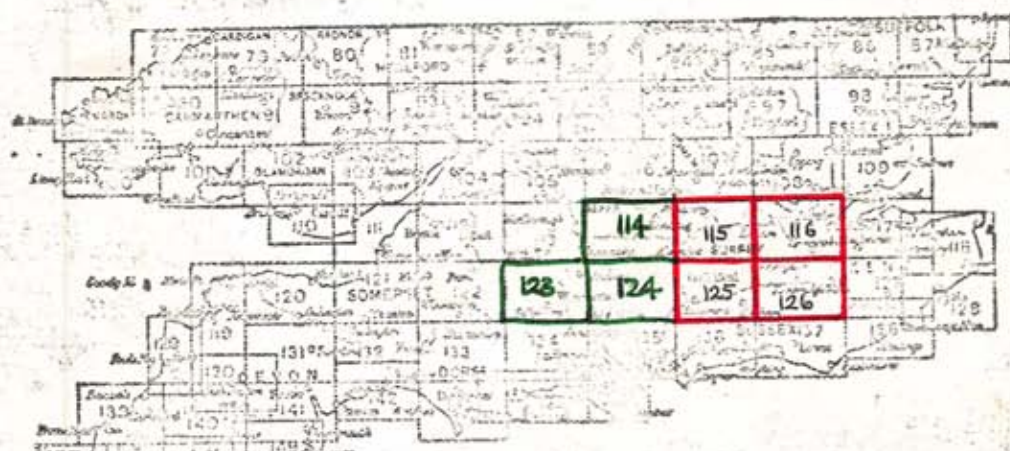

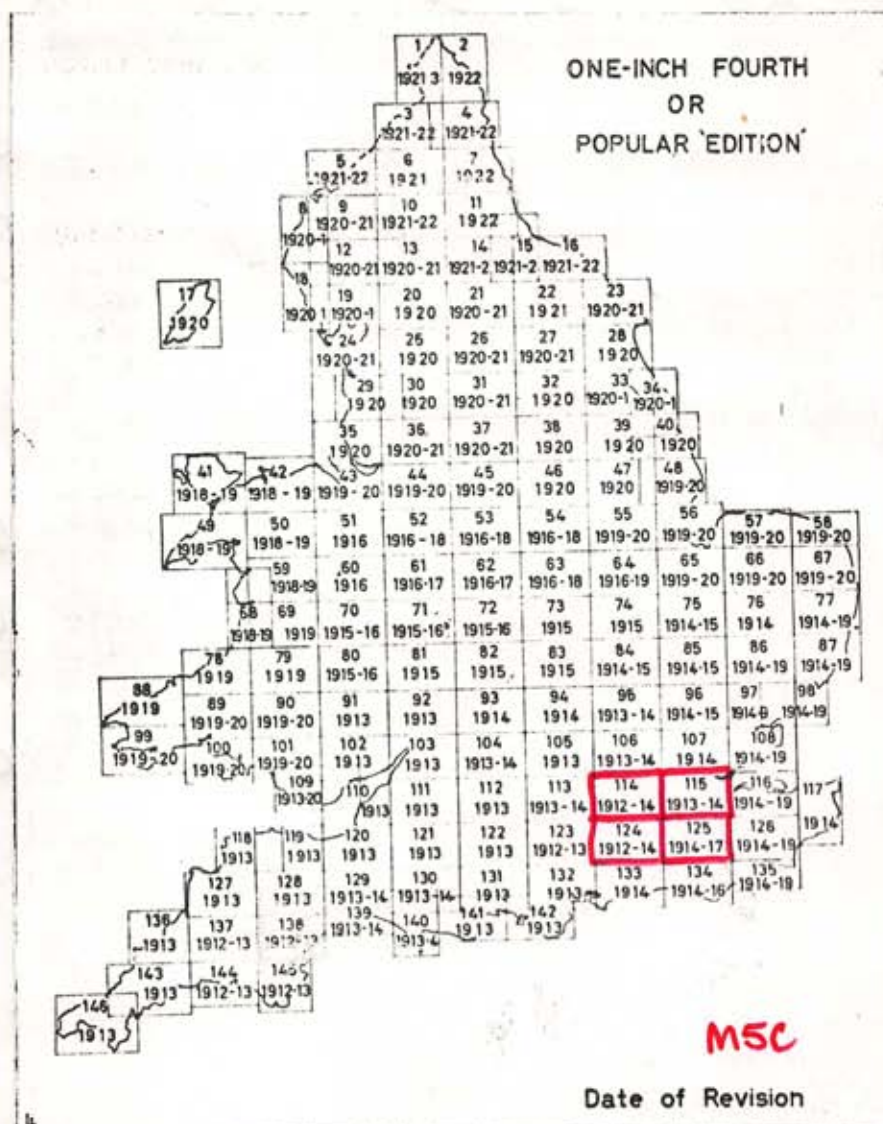

This collection has been built up from many sources, and many of the maps bear annotations made by their previous owners, the significance and/or accuracy of which, are not now always known. Duplicates have been retained where the annotations are substantial. In addition, up until March 1980, there was a second sequence of these maps (formerly M9L) which were acquired from A.G. Howther, the majority of which were also annotated. These have now been amalgamated to form one sequence, but the "Howther maps" which bear annotations have been distinguished from the original sequence by the addition of "(L)". There are sometimes several duplicate copies, but bearing different annotations.

Please note also that the library has sometimes other O.S. 6" quarter sheets which are annotated more specifically, and can be found under the classification by place. Cross references have been supplied from the M9 sequence.

The date is that of publication or latest revision which is often several years after the date of the survey.

EXPLANATION OF THIS INDEX

1. Each page of this index represents one quarter of a 100 kilometre square on the National Grid, and each small square represents one kilometre square in the National Grid. The small squares thus coincide with the grid squares on the One-inch, 1:50 000, 1:25 000, Six-inch and 1:10 000 maps, and represent the area covered by one 1:2500 scale National Grid plan or four 1:1250 scale National Grid plans.

The symbols show the state of publication of the 1:2500 and 1:1250 National Grid plans as follows

- a. Each blank square  represents a 1:2500 scale plan yet to be published or, in the main urban areas where the scale of survey is 1:1250, four 1:1250 scale plans in addition to the 1:2500 scale plan.
- b. Each black dot  represents a published 1:2500 scale National Grid plan.
- c. A line joining two black dots  indicates that those two 1:2500 scale plans are published in a single sheet, the format used for most 1:2500 scale National Grid plans.
- d. Two black dots with a line from one dot to the 1 Km line,  indicate that the sheet is available in the 2 Km x 1 Km format, and additionally the plan represented by the single dot is available in the 1 Km x 1 Km format.
- e. Each diagonal line  represents a published 1:1250 scale National Grid plan.
- f. A black dot in a square of 1:1250 scale plans  represents a 1:2500 scale National Grid plan which has been derived by direct reduction from the 1:1250 scale plans.

 Hatching  indicates areas of mountain and moorland for which 1:10 000 or 1:10 560 is the largest scale available.

2. THE NUMBERING SYSTEM FOR NATIONAL GRID PLANS

a. 1:2500 scale plans

The plan number comprises two letters followed by four figures.

The number of any 1:2500 scale plan in this index is determined as follows -

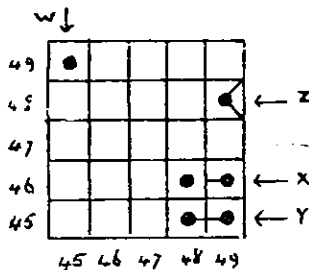
1. Take the two prefix letters in bold type from the top right hand corner of the page (ignore the second pair of letters - NW, NE, SW, SE - which indicates the quarter of the 100 kilometre square).
2. Place after the two prefix letters -
The two figures at the top or bottom of the vertical column ⁱⁿ which the plan occurs, followed by the two figures alongside the plan in the left or right hand margin.

EXAMPLE

The plan at W in the diagram below is numbered TQ 4549

The plans at X are numbered TQ 4846 and TQ 4946 and are available in the 2 Km x 1 Km format, and in addition plan TQ 4846 is available as a 1 Km x 1 Km sheet.

As explained above, most 1:2500 scale plans are published in a 2 Km x 1 Km format. The numbers of both plans should be quoted when the index shows that two plans are so paired.

EXAMPLE

The Sheet at Y in the diagram is numbered TQ 4845 - 4945 - this can be abbreviated to TQ 48/4945.

b. 1:1250 Scale plans

It can be seen from the index that each 1:1250 scale plan covers the area of one quarter of a 1:2500 scale plan.

As a consequence the 1:1250 scale plans take the 1:2500 plan number followed by the letters NW, NE, SW or SE as appropriate.

EXAMPLE

The 1:1250 scale plans at Z in the diagram above are numbered TQ 4948 NE and TQ 4948 SE.

3. HOW TO USE THIS INDEX




a. To determine the National Grid plan number of a given area

Identify the area on the One-inch, 1:25 000, Six-inch 1:50 000, or 1:10 000 map, and from that map determine the number of the National Grid plan covering the area with which you are concerned. (Remember that one grid square on any of those maps equals one smallsquare on this index).

Having determined the plan number proceed as explained in 3b. below.

b. To determine if a National Grid plan whose number you know has been published -

Identify the square representing the plan as explained in paragraph 1 above.

A black dot  shows that a 1:2500 scale National Grid plan is available, a diagonal line  that a 1:1250 National Grid plan is available and a combination of black dot and diagonal lines  that National Grid plans are available at both 1:2500 and 1:1250 scales.

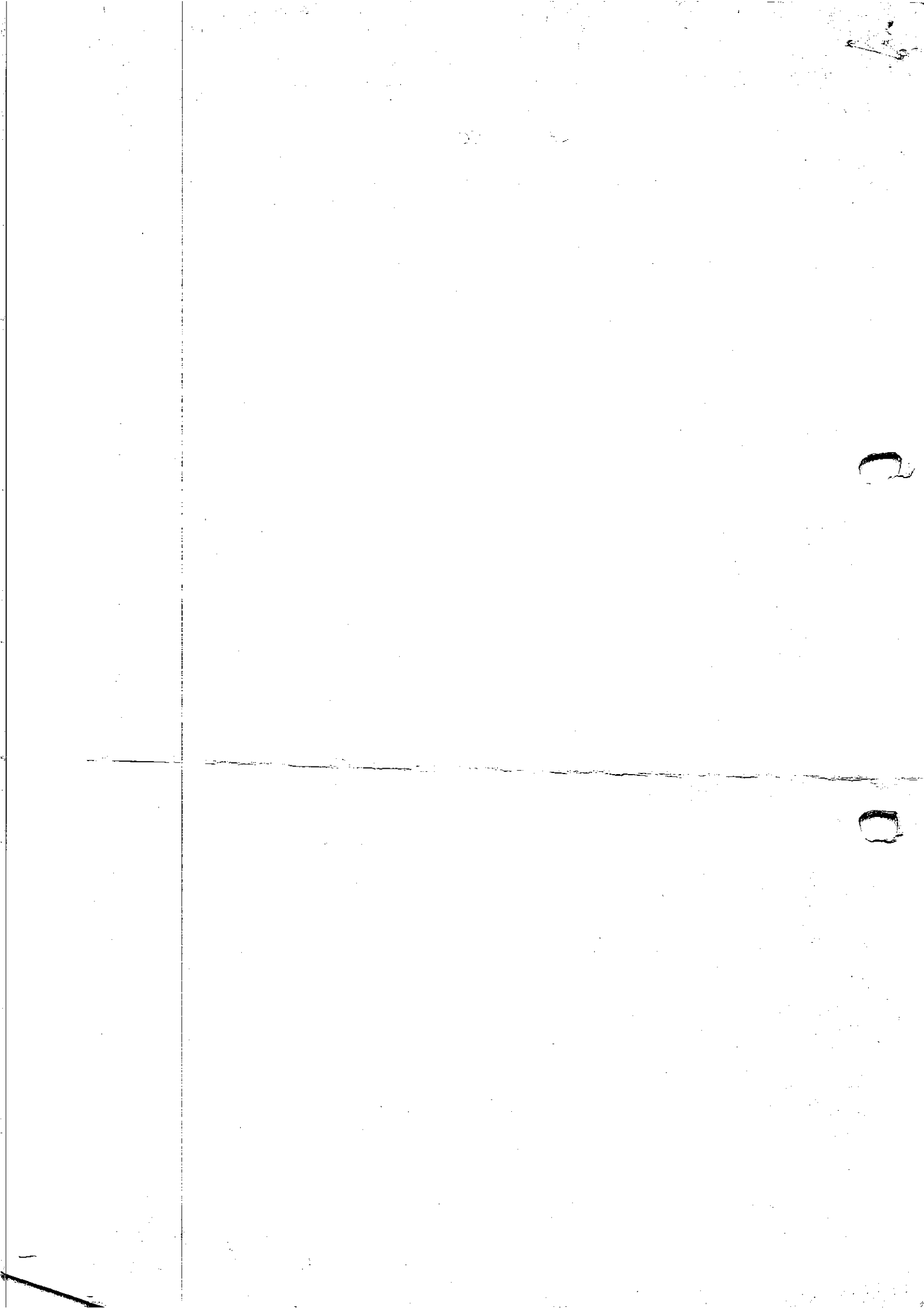
A combination of a black dot and diagonal line shows that the 1:2500 sheet is fully or partially derived from its 1:1250 components.

If the index shows that the National Grid plan is not yet published please refer to the Index to 1:2500 scale County Series plans from which the number of the County Series plan can be determined.
