


In the name of God Amen. I Anthony ffen of Bristol in the County of Sundry
 a good man being sick of body, but in perfect memory, because I know
 not how long or how long the power of this dissolution of my soule from this
 body shall be, I do ordaine & make this my last will & Testament in manner & forme following.
 I do bequeath unto the soule of Almighty God my soule & spirit with
 all grace & favour that may be, beseeching him for my soule & Saviour Christ
 Jesus to be merciful unto my soule, & if I have in this life committed sinnes in deed, or words, or
 thought, & to please him to pardon me & give me a place of rest. And as for this earthly
 tabernacle of my body, from whence it came, & to whence it must returne, after my death I will
 it to be buried in the Churchyard of Bristol at the discretion of mine Exors, being
 fully assured that at the generall resurrection after iust & iudicium, I shall receive it a
 gaine in more excellent estate than was before, & so will my body & soule joyne together
 I shall meet my Lord & Saviour Christ Jesus to mine everlasting joy. Now as touching
 my last will & Testament which God hath given me, & which I have made as aforesaid,
 because I desire that peace may be continually amongst all parties, but most among them our
 neighbours God hath given me a speciall charge, I do give & bequeath unto my two sonnnes
 Anthony ffen, and to my eldest daughter Agnes ffen & John ffen & Elizabeth ffen to have
 one of these my four shillings Six pence a piece of lawfull money, to be paid unto each
 one of them within One yeare after my decease. And if any of them do before that time dye
 I do hereby will that such of these portions of these devised shalbe paid equally among the rest
 of them that do survive. Item I bequeath be half unto my sonnne Anthony in the County of
 Lambeth, and to my daughter Agnes & Elizabeth to divide betweene One Crowne One Lambeth. Item
 I give more unto my sonnne Anthony my great house & doot, & my long Close, & to my daughter
 Elizabeth my great Close. Item my neighbours shall hereafter befall unto me by any other means
 from any other person I do will & bequeath that it shall be divided betweene my wife & my three
 daughers to every one of them part & part like; And that if any of them happen to dye before that
 time, then that also to be equally divided among them that survive. Item I do give unto
 of these portions of these devised to divide betweene Six pence a piece to be paid unto them after my
 decease. And for all the rest of my goods & chattels wherof I am now in possession I do bequeath
 them wholly unto my loving wife & to my sonnne Allen ffen to be divided betweene them. And I do
 make & ordaine my sayd wife & my sayd sonnne Allen to be mine Exors of this my will and
 Testament. And I desire my good friends Anthony Smalle & Richard Decker to be Overseers
 that this my will & Testament be performed, and to divide of them I do give toward these purposes
 One shilling a piece. In witness whereof I have given unto this my last will & Testament
 of April, in the yeare of our Lord God One thousand five hundred & three, In the first yeare
 of the reigne of our sovereigne Lord James by the grace of God of England Scotland
 & Ireland King, Defender of the faith &c.
