

In the name of god Amen, I Alys Handinge of frinscham in the
 County of Surrey, the daughter of Symon Handinge before late
 deceased, being first in body but of good and perfect memory, do make
 and ordeyne by this my last testament including therein my last will in
 manner and forme followinge. first I remound my soule into the hands
 of my redeemer Iesus christe, to whom I becheue I shall
 ascend, and my body to the earth from whence it came, to be buried in the
 churchyard of frinscham aforesaid, Item I give to the church of frinscham
 the sum of ten shillings to be paid to the poor. Item
 I give to my brother Robert Handing two shillings and six pence. Item
 I give to my brother william Handing five shillings. Item I give to
 my sister Elizabeth baker ten shillings. Item I give to my sister Constance
 Combes ten shillings. Item I give to my sister Katherine six tenes shillings
 Item I give and bequeath to my godson Iohn boy lot, and also Kate
 Straw, to see of them twelue pound the rest of all my goods I give
 and bequeath to my brother Iohn Handing, whom I make my sole
 executor, and to see any legatid payd and funerall expensid discharged.
 And I ordeyne and make ordeynid of this my last will, to remaine and
 Iohn Handing brother of frinscham, and will remaine for their paymēt to be
 taken from, to see of them twelue pound. In my last testament I gave to
 the said church the sum of ten shillings the xxij daye of July in the second yere
 of the reigne of our Soveraigne Lord Iohn by the grace of god, of England,
 France and Ireland King, Defender of the faith And of Scotland the 27.
