 Goldson four shillings in money to be divided equally amongst them  
 also I will and give to my goddower margery four pence in money:  
 also I will that my sonne John and my doctour margaret shall have the  
 one halfe of all my householde stuff and if my wife should paye to  
 my wife agayne it to be delivered at the day of your marriage or else not  
 till after your death: all the residue of my goodes and chattell I  
 bequeath and assigne I will and give to my wife my wife I make  
 my will executer to take my debts and to paye my debts: and I  
 will that John Smelling and Richard Botlegam shall be  
 overseers of the my will & testyment that it maye be the better  
 done and fulfilled and they to have for their labor and payment  
 takinge sixtene pence apiece


