 one halfe of all my household stuff and if my wife should paye to
 my wife agayne it to be delivered at the day of your marriage or else not
 till after your death: all the residue of my goodes and chattell I
 bequeathen and assigne I will and give to Alice my wife whom I make
 my will executor to take my debts and to paye my debts: and I
 will that John Smelling and Richard Botlegam shal be
 overseers of the my will & testyment that it maye be the better
 don and fulfilled and they to have for their labor and payment
 takinge fortye pounds apiece
