

In the name of god Amen The xxvijth day of December  
 Anno 1609 I Sir Giham of Wyke of Windlesham poudor, being  
 sicke in body but of good and perfect remembrance of my mind  
 doe make and ordaine this my last will and Testament in  
 maner and forme followinge. First I bequeath my soule to  
 Almighty god, restinge assured by grace, the mercie of god  
 spirit to be saved, and my body to be buried in the church  
 yard of Windlesham, and my goods I bequeath, as followeth  
 first I give to the poore of the parisshe to be paid upon  
 presently after my deathe, iij s. 4d. And I give to my sister  
 the Jactson the best pceduled, and the biggest kettles silver  
 one, and a drest, to be delivred her presently after my  
 deathe. And I give to the two daughters of my sister the  
 viz. Mary and Johane Jactson each of them a platter and one  
 care, of silver a pceder to be delivred them presently after  
 my deathe. And I give to Henry Atfield, and Johane Atfield  
 beinge the children of John Atfield my brother, each  
 of them a platter to be delivred them presently after my  
 deathe. And I give to my brother William Atfield his  
 two daughters each of them a pceder dish, to be delivred  
 them presently after my deathe. And I give to Elizabeth  
 Maryner daughter of John Maryner the youngest sonne  
 the best drest, and my best hatt to be delivred her presently after  
 my deathe. And I give to John Maryner the sonne of John  
 Maryner, a brass pott to be delivred him after the deathe  
 of the said Maryner his mother. And I give to the wife  
 of the said John Maryner, each of them a platter  
 to be delivred them after the deathe of the said Maryner  
 their mother. The rest of all my goods and chattels  
 unbestowed, after the said my debts and funeral be discharge  
 I give and bequeath to John Maryner his sonne  
 and to the said his wife, to use the good of the said children  
 ordaininge the said John Maryner the sole executor  
 of this my last will and Testament. And I  
 appoint for overseer to see my will, John Atfield the  
 younger and Thomas Hart allowinge them for their  
 paynt vij s. 6d. In witness whereof I have put  
 to my hand the day above written.
