 next after my decease. And I give to
 Christopher Woodde my kinsman Edward Tompey of good & lawfull
 memory of England to be payd unto him by my executor one
 mircabill^{daye} next after my decease. And I give to
 John Woodde my kinsman Edward Tompey of good & lawfull
 memory of England to be payd unto him by my executor one
 mircabill^{daye} next after my decease.

So I bequeath of all my goods movable & immovable my debts
 Legacies and finally discharged I give will and bequeath
 unto John Woodde of the County of Northampton
 of Scotland whom I make executor of this my last will and
 testament. And I ordaine & make overseer of this my
 last will & testament Thomas Jauntor vicar of Scotland
 and John Woodde of the County of Northampton my MS. In
 witness whereof I have putte my hand these bearing
 witness.
