In the name of god amen the xxij day of october in the seventh year of the reign of our sovereign lord James by the grace of
 god king of great brittain france and ireland king of scotland the three and sixties J^r Thomas maxon of p^risbury
 in the county of surrey gentleman being in the body and of full memory granted and gave unto the church of
 god do give ordayne and make in this writing my last will and testament in manner and forme following that is to
 say first I comend my soule into the hands of almighty god my creator John christ lord summe my only sonne my
 widow and my bodie to the church to be buried in christin church in the town of p^risbury
 aforesaid - I do give and bequeath to my wife one Elizabeth and asethed and abonafter any two p^restres
 and vicars of the same church to be appointed by the churchwardens and p^restres of the same church and bequeath unto
 the said aliche my wife yearly some pounds of good and lawfull money of england during the term of her life
 to be payed by my sonne John maxon and my daughter maxon upon condition of a certain ^{or more} legacy I have made
 my sonne John my will is that he should paye to my wife the xxij pounds so long as she shall
 live and willim ^{my sonne} shall paye to aliche my wife - the xxij pounds so long as she shall live
 money of england and my will is that my sonne shall paye to aliche my wife - the xxij pounds so long as she shall

 quarter of the year the first day of the quarter John christ my bequest to her xxij pounds my daughter some pounds of
 good and lawfull money of england to be paid unto her with in three monthes next after my decease John christ
 my bequest unto Elizabeth my daughter some pounds of good and lawfull money of england to be paid unto her
 with in three monthes next after my decease also I have and bequeath unto my sonne John maxon as my will
 appoynted both land and money which I have at the time of my decease all the residue of my goods and chattels
 whatsover which I have at the time of my decease and not given I have do bequeath unto willim
 maxon my sonne whom I have appoynted as my only executor of this my last will and testament and he
 to pay my debts and see executed by me in this my last will named and bequeathed and discharged
 my final expenses and I constitute my kinsmen John maxon and Thomas Smith to be overseers of this my
 last will and testament requesting them to do their best endeavors to see this my will fulfilled and for the
 payment there in I have unto either of them - the xxij pounds of good and lawfull money of england or
 the residue of the residue of my goods and chattels and my residue of my goods and chattels to be
 distributed by my said executor and cox by I do desire and make void all former wills and testaments
 what so ever by me before the date here made or devised in witness whereof I have hereunto sett my
 hand and sealed the day and year first above written with my own hand
