 declare this my last will and Testament in manner and forme followinge **Item**
 I doe give my soule into the hand of Almighty god And my body to the earth from
 whence it came to be buried with the Buriall of Henham or in the Church yard att the
 discretion of mine exors
Item I doe give and bequeath unto the gift of Henham
 Henham sheweth the sum of ten poundes of lawfull money
Item I doe give unto the poor
 of the said gift of Henham the sum of ten poundes
Item I doe give to my naturall sonne William
 the sonne of Henham the sum of twenty poundes of lawfull money of England to be paid unto him within
 one yeare after my decease And I doe give more unto him Ten poundes to be delivered
 unto him within one month after my decease **Item** I doe give unto my naturall
 daughter Susan the sum of twenty poundes of lawfull money of England to be paid
 unto her att the day of her mariage or when she shall accomplish the age of one and
 twenty yeares or first shall happen **Item** I doe give unto my naturall sonne Thomas
 the sonne of Henham the sum of twenty poundes of lawfull money of England to be paid unto him when she
 shall accomplish the age of one and twenty yeares **Item** I doe give unto my naturall
 daughter Elizabeth the sum of ten poundes of lawfull money of England to be paid
 unto her when she shall accomplish the age of one and twenty yeares or att the
 day of her mariage or first shall happen **And** if it shall happen any of my said
 three youngest children to decease before they shall have received their said portions that
 then my will and mind is that their portion shall be equally divided amongst those that shall
 then livinge **Item** I doe give unto my sonne in law William Norcott six of my children
 to care of them three one lamb **Item** I doe give to my brother in law Henry Norcott
 six of my children to care of them two and one penny **Item** I doe give to my loving
 brother in law Thomas Norcott and his wife to care of them five shillings a peece for a
 remembrance **Item** I doe give and bequeath to my loving sonne in law William Norcott
 and his wife to care of them five shillings a peece for a remembrance **Item**
 all the rest of my good chattels and debts I doe give and bequeath unto my loving
 wife Elizabeth whom I doe make and appoint sole executrix of this my last will
 and Testament **And** I doe make and appoint my loving sonne in law William
 Norcott and my loving friend George Orat rap and John Rayward overseers of
 this my will and Testament to be selected to my executrix to see it performed
 and for their paines to be taken thereabout I doe give unto them Ten poundes a
 peece for a remembrance And so I leave I leave more upon my soule
