 said messuage or tenement barne bnting Land tenent and a messuage with the or dwey of
 the aforesaid messuage unto the said Sirs Richard Billinghurst and William Gifford their heires
 or assigns for ever with all the appoynting and Covenants containinge the said Land or
 any part thereof or with the or dwey thereof as is written in my will and mynd is and
 I give unto them from my said Land only to and for the intent and purpose followinge and
 to and for no other intent use or purpose that is to say that the said Sirs Richard Billinghurst
 and William Gifford shall not in any sort time after my decease make sale of all my
 said Land for above money or to them bequeathed for the payement and discharge of all
 my debts and after my debts be fully discharged the residue thereof remaininge after
 my debts paid my will and mynd is that it shall remaine to my three daughters to be
 equally divided betwixt them I give & bequeath unto Elizabeth Denny Agnes
 Denny and Jane Denny my three daughters after my debts paid & discharged all
 my good chattels & chattels what so ever beinge with in the parish of Emswilt aforesaid
 or elsewhere with in the Realme of England to be equally divided betwixt them I make
 Elizabeth Denny my daughter Executrix of this my last will and Testament And
 first by my will and mynd is that of the said Elizabeth my daughter doe not with in one
 month next ensuinge my decease take upon her the said Executors for and rowe this my last
 and Testament in forme of Lawe I give & bequeath the before named Sirs Richard Billinghurst
 and William Gifford my brother in Lawe Executors to this my last will and Testament And
 I appoynt my beloved brother in Lawe William Billinghurst and John Nye & their heires to
 be the my last will & Testament Trusting that they will for the same truly execute accordinge
 to the meaninge thereof In Witnesse whereof to this my last will & Testament writinge
 and former wills by me before made I have set my hand and Seale the daye and yeare
 first above written in the presence of those whose names are subscribed hereafter
