 of Shropshire aforesaid. Item I give & bequeath unto Eugenius my
 eldest sonne the first yeares rent or profite of my lease land
 Eugenius the second yeares rent or profite of my said lease after my
 decease. Item I give & bequeath unto Isabell my yongest sonne the
 first yeares rent or profite of my said lease after my decease. Item
 I give & bequeath unto Anne Jaxon the daughter of James my sonne
 the fourth yeares rent or profite of the said lease after my
 decease. And if shee happen to die before the tyme shee should receive the
 same then my will is that it shall be equally divided betwene my sonne
 Robert the second yeares rent or profite of my lease after my decease.
 Item I give & bequeath unto Anne my sonne Robert's daughter
 the fifth yeares rent or profite of my lease after my decease. And if
 shee die before the tyme shee should receive it, then I
 will that it shall come wholly unto Mary her sister. Item I give & bequeath
 unto Elizabeth my sonne Isabell's eldest daughter the sixth yeares rent or
 profite of my lease. Item I give & bequeath unto Agnes my sonne Isabell's
 yongest daughter the seventh yeares of my lease the rent or profite
 thereof & if either of them two happen to dye before the tyme they should
 receive it then my will is that it shall remaine unto the survivors of them
 Item I give & bequeath unto John Jaxon Richard Jaxon & Elizabeth Jaxon
 the three children of John Jaxon my sonne the rent or profite of the
 two next yeares after then before them to be equally divided betwene
 them & if either of them happen to dye before the tyme shee should
 receive it then I will it shall remaine unto the survivors of them
 Item I give unto Eugenius my sonne my best bedd & bolster & my best
 downelett with the beddstead thereto belonginge Item I give unto Robert
 my sonne my worst bedd & to Anne his eldest daughter my longest dyest
 and to Agnes my sonne Isabell's daughter my short dyest Item I give
 unto my sonne Eugenius his wife & my sonne Isabell's wife my English hoes to
 be equally divided betwene them. All the rest of my good & bequeathed
 I give & bequeath unto James my sonne whom I ordains & make my
 executor. and I request Eugenius the second to be my overseer and
 I give him for his paynes etc
