

In the Name of God Amen, I Joh: Fulmer, of Witley, in the County of
Surrey, yeoman, being sick in body, but in good and perfect remembrance
of my mind, do give to God, do make this my last will and testament, in manner
and form following: First I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God
giving assent, that through his merits, I pass to our Lord Jesus
Christ, I shall attain unto life everlasting, and my body to be
buried in the Churchyard of Witley aforesaid: And as for my goods,
wherewith God hath blessed me, I do bequeath them in manner and in
form following: Imprimis I give and bequeath unto my eldest brother
Thomas Fulmer of Duppur: Esquire some things of four parts, to be
payed unto him by my Executors within twelve months after my decease. Item
I give unto my brother Edward Fulmer of Witley five pounds of
good English money, to be payed to him, or his Exor, or assigns within twelve
months after my decease likewise. Item I give unto Anne my eldest
sister, widow of John father of Haseburn five pounds of good current
English money, to be payed to her, within twelve months after my decease. Item
I give to my sister Margaret, the wife of Joh: Brown of Farnham
five pounds of good current English money, to be payed within twelve months after my decease.
Item I give unto my sister Anne, the wife of Joh: Oliver of Brampton
five pounds likewise of good current English money, within twelve months after
my decease. Item I give unto my kinswoman Anne Callingham, the eldest
daughter of my sister Elizabeth, deceased, sixteen pounds of good current En-
glish money, to be payed to her, within twelve months after my decease, and
after my decease, unto my overseers of this my last will of best mind; and
they to make the best benefit of it, for the half of the said Anne Callingham
Exor, and they to pay the said sixteen pounds, within the best benefit thereof
unto her the said Anne Callingham, when she shall accomplish the full
age of eighteen years. Item I give unto Elizabeth Callingham,
the third daughter of my sister Eliz: Callingham deceased, seven pounds
of good current English money. Item I give unto Leticia the
youngest daughter of my sister Eliz: Callingham, seven pounds likewise
of good current English money: And within fourteen pounds of good
to be payed by my Exor, unto my overseers, within twelve months after my de-
cease: And they to make the best benefit of it, on the half of the said
Elizabeth and Leticia Callingham, and to pay unto them the said seven
pounds, when they shall accomplish the full age of eighteen years.
Item I give unto Thomas Billinghurst my godson, the son of Robt Billinghurst deceased twenty pounds
