 Counts of the Court being sick in body but of perfect memory I have be be always to god before doo make to id  
 my Testament & last will & devise in manner & forme following: First I bequeeth my soules to Almighty  
 god my maker & redeemer & my bodie to his want from whence it came And to be buried in the Churchyard of the  
 City of London to be payd to Iohn Exton my youngest sone ten pounds of lawfull money  
 bested & a shrook bed with all appoyntments belonging thereunto next after my decease I give to Iohn Exton my  
 daughter I give & bequeeth to Katherine my daughter ten shales of good & true weight of lawfull money  
 of England I give & bequeeth to Ursula my wife six pounds of lawfull money of England yearly to  
 be payd to her out of all my free land during the terme of her naturall life in manner & forme following  
 that is to say the first payment to be made in one quarter of a year next after my decease And further  
 that if the first payment to be made in one quarter of a year next after my decease And further  
 I will that if the said six pounds shall not be payd quarterly as at one said that I have further  
 it shall & may be good & lawfull to the said Ursula my wife into all my free land to enter & distraine And  
 for default or distress thereon & there so as is taken lawfully to have & receive as a debt & as if  
 the same to be done without any delay I have further  
 I give & bequeeth to Ursula my wife fully satisfied & payd with the same six pounds  
 & not given & next one bed & a bolster & one parrot of blankets & a coverlet & all my bookes created for  
 & husbandrie wearing bodys & tooles shall remaine to my Executor Item I give & bequeeth to the same Ursula  
 my wife two rooms in my dwelling house during the time of her life & at it to say the body chamber  
 over the shop & the chimney with liberties to goe & come to the fire at her owne pleasure to doe  
 her necessaries I give & bequeeth to Iohn Exton my Appoynted one ewelambe to be delivered to Iohn  
 one morder next after my decease I give & bequeeth to William Exton my eldest sone xxij pounds I doo make  
 my wifes & Executors & my free land And all my good & chattels movable & imovable  
 unbestowed & not given And so to pay my debts & charges & my funeral expenses And I Appoynt to be  
 my overseer Thomas Crigg And a woman great of the City of London And I give to every  
 of them for their services in this behalf & what shall be due to them all their wills & testaments I utterly  
 revoke & annull & in witness whereof I have subscribed my hand & seal the xxvijth day of June 1628

for my services. Ite I give & bequeath to John & Anne my Apprentices one small Lamb to be delivered to me within  
one month next after my decease. Ite I give & bequeath to William & Anne my eldest sons some wages of 100 marks  
my wife & I have for my service & my free land. And all my goods & chattels movable & immovable  
subsequently to be given. And so to my son Robert & my daughter & my funeral & expenses. And I desire to be  
my overseer & Thomas. Crispe And I desire that all the debts of my wife & my son & my daughter  
of them for to be paid in full before I will my executor call them with & testaments of, utterly  
revoked & if any be in witness whereof I have subscribed my hand & seal the day & year first  
about written
