

In the name of god amen the 25<sup>th</sup> day of may 1629:

I Benjamin Maidman of Wimbysam in the County of Surrey husband man being but weak in bodie but of good and perfect remembrance of praise god doe make and ordaine my last will and testament in manner and forme as followeth And firste I bequeath my soule unto almighty god resting assured by your merits of his sonne Iesus Christe to be saved and my bodie to be buried in the churchyard of Wimbysam aforesaid and my goods and chattels I bequeath as followeth:

Item I give and bequeath unto my sonne William Maidman the summe of fortie shillings within twelvemonthes to be payed unto him w<sup>ch</sup> twelvemonthes after my deathe. Item my will is that my sonne William shall have and all that belongeth unto it after my wife Margarett's deathe. Item I give unto any time of years to come my house and my will is that my said sonne William shall have unto my daughter Agnes Maidman the summe of

ten shillings yearly during the time that she shall enjoy my said house w<sup>ch</sup> she hath purchased from me and bequeath unto my daughter Agnes Maidman two of my beste kyttes to be delivered unto her w<sup>ch</sup> twelvemonthes after my deathe further I give unto my daughter Agnes my beste feather bed and all that belongeth unto it to be delivered after my wife's deathe further I give unto my daughter Agnes the summe of ten shillings yearly to be delivered unto her w<sup>ch</sup> twelvemonthes after my wife's deathe. Item my will is that all my brass and pewter should be equally divided betwene my sonne William and my daughter Agnes after my wife's deathe. Item my will is that if my sonne Thomas maidman be living and doo come againe that he should have a parte and portion in all the goods that are left behind in as large a manner as sitte to my children and after all my debts and funerall expences all the residue of my goods and chattels

shall goe unto my daughter Agnes. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 25<sup>th</sup> day of may 1629.
