upon the condition that he the said Thomas Golt shall
keep and bringe up my boye Thomas Golt and paye to my
sonne Robert Golt out of this house twenty pound yearly
in hand to paye him and if the said Thomas shall refuse to paye
the twenty pound then the said Robert shall take the
said house and paye Thomas twenty pound yearly and
bequeath unto my sonne Golt for his shillings to be payed
him by my executor after my decease my wife Golt and
do make my wife Elizabeth Golt my whole and sole executore
of this my last will and testament and do in test my loving
friende Thomas Duffie of witliam and Richard most of Drapton
to be my own part of this my will in witness whereof I the
said ~~William~~ William Golt have hereunto set my hand and
seal in the presence of the witnesses whose names are hereunto
written
