in the year of our Lord 1630. I William Scotcher of the  
pitt of the county of Devon being of whole mind and perfect re-  
embrance land and groud be with Allmightie god doe make and  
ordaine this my last testament concerning herein my last will  
in manner and content following. That is to say first I content my  
soul into Allmightie gods my maker and redee me and my body  
to be buried in the pitt Churchyard of the said in the Countie of  
Surre: In It: I will that all my debts and duties as I owe of right  
or of conscience to any person or persons be well and truly paid  
and yet by myne Executor good after number, and after my  
debts paid, and my funeral expenses performed I will that my  
Executor shall pay unto my son John three score pounds at the  
age of one and twenty years: It I give unto my son  
Scotcher the like sum of three score pounds to be paid at the fore-  
said age of one and twenty years And also I give and bequeath unto  
my daughter Annis Scotcher the sum of four score pounds to  
be paid unto her selfe at the day of marriage or at the age of  
one and twenty years wher shall first happen but if either of my  
said children should decease before they come to the said ages of  
one and twenty, then my will is that the portion wher was due to the  
said should be equally divided amongst the survivors of my  
children. And for the best part maintenance and education until  
they come to the said age of one and twenty my will is that my  
Executor should allow every of them five pounds yearly to be paid  
out or reserved for their goods according to the discretion of  
my Executor and overseers in It my will and intent is that  
my daughter in law Henry Medlett and my brother in law John Wadley  
or they either shall have the keeping and government of my said  
decease during they norage. It I give unto the poor of the pitt of  
the residue of all my lands, goods, and chattels and debts, after my debts  
paid my funeral expenses performed and these my legacies contained  
in this my last testament fulfilled I will give and bequeath to  
my eldest son William Scotcher also I make my sole executor  
and of the execution of this my will I make and ordaine my  
son Wadley or they either overseers of this my last testament.  
and I hereby revoke all and every other former written, will and  
legacy, Executor and overseers by me in any will before this time  
made in full witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seale  
at London the xxijth of february 1630
