but whole and sound in mind & memory god J. give (Imprando) do make & declare this my
Testament and last will in manner and forms following viz first & principally I do
bequeath my soules into the hands & protection of god my Creator and maker, and to Jesus
Christ my only mediator and redeemer by whose death & Merits & righteousness I
do hope to have free pardon & forgiveness of all my sins & offences And my body I do
commit to god vnto to be buried in the Church yard

Also I do give & bequeath vnto my loving wife my best Bed, with all things thereto
belonging together with 4 paire of my best sheets

Also I do give vnto my son in lawe John Warner Twelue pence

Also I do give vnto my son in lawe John wife of Warner Twelue pence

Also I do give & bequeath vnto my eldest son John Wheatly All & singular his goods, w^{ch}
my said son John now hath in his custody & possession

Also I do give vnto my daughter Margaret Twelue pence

Also I do give vnto my daughter Elizabeth Twelue pence

Also I do give vnto my daughter Katherine Twelue pence

Also I do give & bequeath vnto all & each of my grand children Twelue pence a pence

Also I do give vnto my grand child which is to say John Roke his younger of Oxobury
in the County of Surre five shillings of lawfull money to be paid vnto him at the age
of five years.

The rest of my goods & chattels (I have and have to) I do give vnto my neerer son
whom I do ordaine and appoint to be my youngest son Richard Wheatly
And for the oversight of this my will I do desire & appoint to be Henry Mellist the elder
of Oxobury & my son in lawe John Roke of Oxobury giving vnto them for their pains
five shillings a pence.
