 being sick in body but of good memory most humbly I give unto Almighty
 god for it. yet considering the mortality of man doe hereby last day of April Anno Domini 1640
 doe make this my last will & Testament in manner & forme herein contained. That is to say
 first I bequeath my soule unto Almighty god faithfully believing that through his only mercie
 & merit of Iesus Christ shoulde come my children & mine to the promise of all my sinner
 & to be accepted into the number of those Saints whose sinne shall not be imputed unto them
 & I bequeath my body to be buried in Christian burials in face of a faithful resurrection.
 It I give unto the Church of Chillingworth etc. It I give unto Sara Mardon my now
 wife all my lands called or knowne by the name of Honfild being esteemed Sixteen
 Acres of land or thereabout. It I give unto her my house with the house & now abode in
 the said parish of Honfild together with all the lands & things belonging thereto. It I give
 her all my goods & chattells whatsoever, & my will & meaning is that she shoulde
 have all my said house & lands & chattells during her life & doe hereby
 make my said wife my sole executrix, & my will & meaning is after the
 death of my said wife, my son Thomas Mardon shall enjoy all the lands
 called by the name of Honfild & also my house with all the lands & things there
 unto belonging & also the garden & orchard & also the garden & orchard
 my will & meaning is that all my debts & debts due to me shoulde be paid
 & the residue thereof shoulde remaine unto my son Thomas & his heirs & executrix
 for ever after the death of my said wife above mentioned, & doe make
 this my last will & Testament, And also I doe make Richard Abgron
 & John Paton of Wexanders Coty of Chillingworth yeomen to be my overseers
 of this my last will & Testament & I give unto them: & doe hereby
 In witness whereof I have caused this writing to be made
 & for my last will & Testament in testimony hereof
 I have hereunto sett my hand & Seale
