 pardon and remission of all my sinnes and my boode to ther parts to bee decently
 buried in Chistian buriall according to the direction of myne Executors hereafter
 named Item I doe give and bequale unto the poore people of the parisshe of Chobham
 aforesaid the summe of xvi shillings to be distributed amongst them at the daye of my
 funerall by my Executors hereafter named Item I doe give and bequale unto Mr George
 Gibson Margarett Gibson Thomas Gibson Jane Gibson and John Gibson Executors of Thomas
 Gibson of Bagshot in the said County of Surrey the summe of thre poundes a peice of
 lawfull monay of England to bee paid unto them within one moneth next after the decease
 of me the said Henry Taylor and Margarett my newe wife And if it shall happen that
 any of the said ffyue Executors of the said Thomas Gibson aforesnamed shall happen to dy
 before their said legatis of thre poundes commed a roote shall bee due unto them That then my will
 and meaning is that the carke and boord of obyn one boordyng shall be squallid
 amonst the rest suruisours Item I doe give and bequale unto Henry Taylor my forme
 twelue pence in monay Item I doe give and bequale unto my daughter Susan
 newe wife of Thomas Worts of Chobham aforesaid the summe of twelue pence in monay
 to bee paid unto them within one moneth next after the decease of me the said
 Henry Taylor and Margarett my wife aforesaid All the residue of my Goods
 and Chattals whiche and not bequeathed my debts paid and funerall expences
 discharged I give and bequale unto Margarett my wife whome I doe make
 sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament And I doe nominate and
 appoint my very loyall friend John Hillar of Chobham aforesaid woman to bee
 Executer of this my last Will and Testament requestinge I m to god his best
 endeavours to see this my will fulfilled And for his more care and paynes theron
 to bee taken I doe give unto him two shillings and six pence over and aboue his
 charges and exences In witness whereof I the said Henry Taylor have hereunto
 sett my hand and seale the twentieth daye of September in the tenth yeare
 of the reigne of our souveraine lord Charles by the grace of god Kinge of Englands
 Bretaines Ierusalem and Hielands defender of the faith etc Chobham 1634
