August in the seventeenth year of the reign of  
our Sovereign Lord Charles by the grace of God  
king of England, Scotland, France & Ireland,  
Defender of the faith &c. And in the year of our  
Lord God. one thousand six hundred, ffortie  
and one. I Bonarino Jourd of Harngam  
in the County of Surrey, miller, beinge sick  
& weak in body, but of sound & perfect Reason  
= braun (blessed be god) doe make, publish,  
& declare this my last will & testament (revoking  
all other) in manner & forme followinge. vizt.  
First I bequeth my Soule into the hands of  
Almighty God, thro wh whose merits in Jesus  
Christ I hope to be saved: And my body, I  
commit to y<sup>e</sup> earth to be buried in decent &  
orderly manner according to the discretion  
of my Executors; And as touching these worldly  
goods wh God hath lent mee I give & bequeth  
as followeth.

I give unto the Rector of Winton, six pence,  
I give unto the poor people of y<sup>e</sup> parish of  
Gronwall forty Shillings.

I give unto my Brother John Jourd of Eltham  
the sum of twenty Shillings, wh in a quarter of a  
year after my decease to be paid him.

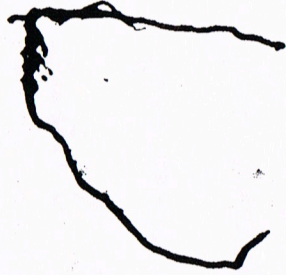
I give to my two sisters, Joane & Barbarie  
to either of them twenty Shillings, to be paid  
them within one quarter of a year next after my  
decease.

The Rest of my goods, rattles, and  
& bequeth unto Alice Frost, the daughter of William  
Frost of Gronwall Parson, whom I make full, and  
sole Executor of this my last will & testament.  
And for y<sup>e</sup> more faithful & forward execution  
I desire my good friends Joseph Grover & George  
Eves both of Gronwall to be my overseers, And I
