What is a 'local list'?

- National planning guidance designated and nondesignated heritage assets
- Local lists are one way of identifying nondesignated heritage assets – usually at local planning authority level
- Buildings, monuments, sites, places, areas, parks, gardens and designed landscapes – including archaeological areas
- Assets with local character or significance but not meeting the criteria for national designation
- Capture and reflect what is valued by local communities
- Material weight in planning process
- Source of information for owners (custodians)
- Information added to the HER
- Place making, local distinctiveness, regeneration

Surrey Local Heritage List Project

- MHCLG (now DLUHC) funding to 22 project groups (2021)
- Part of 'Build Back Better' initiative/planning reform agenda
- Patchy coverage of local lists, absence of national guidance/framework
- Develop local heritage asset lists (aka local lists)
- Funded two temporary posts at SCC
- Running to end of 2022
- Six of eleven Surrey districts involved (Elmbridge, Epsom and Ewell, Mole Valley, Surrey Heath, Tandridge, Woking)
- Public engagement and involvement

Project Stages

Historic England Advice Note No. (HEAN) 7 identifies 7 stages:

- Commencement
- Criteria
- Identification
- Assessment

- Approval
- Publication
- Review





The Project So Far

Part 1 – Commencement and Criteria

- Project commenced July 2021
- Criteria developed in line with Historic England guidance
- Formulated with input from SyAS, Surrey Gardens Trust, Arts and Crafts Movement of Surrey, Surrey Industrial History Group, CBA (SE)
- Close liaison with 6 partner districts and boroughs
- Assets will need to meet at least two criteria



Criteria

- A. Rarity (age)
- **B.** Group Value
- C. Architectural or artistic value
- D. Archaeological Value
- **E.** Historic Association
- F. Landmark Status
- G. Social or Cultural Value



The Project So Far

Part 2 – Identification

- Identification existing lists and nominations
- Nominations process online for 6 weeks October/November 2021
- Publicised/promoted by districts and boroughs through their websites
- Approximately 1000 assets nominated
- Buildings, structures, street furniture, parks and gardens, trackways and paths, public spaces, memorials















The Project So Far

Part 3 – Research and Assessment

- Review of existing lists limited (or no) information
- Old Grade IIIs, ad hoc additions, building-centric
- Research assisted by small team of volunteers (Kingston University)
- Sources: HER, DBRG, historic maps, online
- Assessments made against criteria based on research plus information submitted with nominations
- Short description and summary of significance (using criteria)



Archaeological Assets

- Archaeological sites and areas can be identified on local lists
- Surrey long established designations – CSAIs and AHAPs – non designated heritage assets
- Complementary designations one of criteria is archaeological value – e.g. of multi phase buildings, parks and gardens
- Some nominations referred for inclusion as AHAPs



Next Steps

- Draft lists for districts and boroughs
- Two down, four to go!
- Approx. 300/400 assets on each list
- Will work their way through local authority consultation processes, for adoption late 2022/early 2023
- Can then be given weight in planning process
- Local adoption of criteria
- Review methodology
- Local to Statutory
- HER revealed on searches, to inform heritage statements
