Puttenham Terrier Transcription Project

This online project has been set-up in order to obtain an accurate transcription of the names and other information contained within the 1765 terrier of the entire parish of Puttenham. It is hoped that the outcome will not only be a full digital transcription of the terrier, but that transcribers will become more confident in their abilities to comprehend

historical handwriting found as in original documentary sources, as well as think about the meanings of the names they transcribe and possible etymologies.
