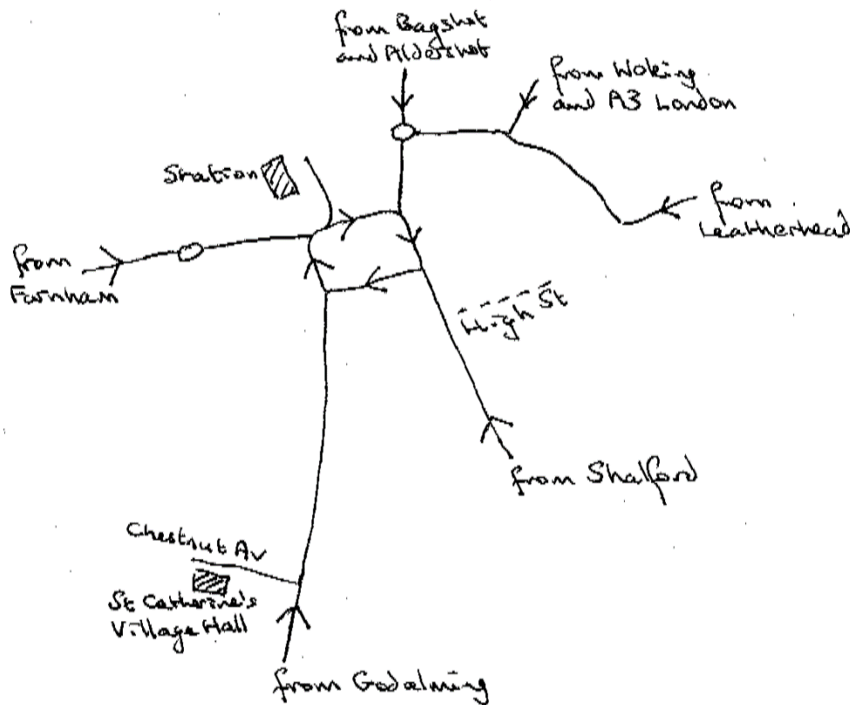

Location of St Catherine's Village Hall



St Catherine's Village Hall is located in Chestnut Avenue on the south side of Guildford, just off the Portsmouth Road, about $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile south of the Railway Station and the Town Centre. The Hall is about a 15-20 minute walk from Guildford Town centre with its coffee shops, cafes and bakeries.
