LOCATION

Holy Trinity Church is the big red-brick church on the High Street, opposite Abbot's Hospital and near Sainsbury's. It is a 10-15-minute walk from the railway station and the bus station. The Trinity Centre is the church hall along the path at the east end of the church, from the High Street. If coming from Sydenham Road turn right along the path and follow it round the church yard

PARKING

Park & Ride buses are available from several directions.

Car parks. There are plenty in Guildford. The closest is the Castle Car Park in Sydenham Road behind the churchyard, but it is expensive for a long stay. Others are Bedford Road, Bright Hill, Farnham Road, Leapale Road, Millbrook, Tunsgate, York Road etc.
